


Old Bonhomme Road Restoration Project



Site preparation and tree removals will begin April 11, 2016 and will likely take one week to complete depending on the weather. The workzone for this phase will be from Price to Olive Blvd.

The next phase of construction will close one lane of Old Bonhomme Road from Dielman Road east to Price Road. Traffic flow will be restricted to one way west bound from Price to Dielman beginning April 13th. Spencer Contracting will begin work from Price Road on the south side of Old Bonhomme.

Old Bonhomme Road Restoration Project

What to Expect

Project Scope Includes:

- Sidewalk replacement per ADA Guidelines
- New Curb and Gutters
- Pavement mill and asphalt overlay
- Ameren UE, AT&T and Charter Utility improvements and relocations

Drive Slow – Construction Zone

WORKZONE SPEED LIMIT – 20 MPH

Project Process:

- Site Preparation – Tree Removals
- Utility relocations
- Sidewalk replacement
- Property restoration
- Driveway apron replacement
- Curb and gutter replacement
- Pavement milling
- Asphalt overlay

Construction Zone Safety

- Drive slowly and cautiously
- Remain calm. Construction crews will accommodate you as efficiently as possible. In active working areas, wait for a signal before proceeding
- Keep children away from equipment and materials. It is difficult for workers to see children, and there are many potential hazards.
- Children and parents are welcome to watch from a safe distance.
- Cyclists should watch for construction vehicles in the work zone and ride or walk their bike on the grass when a vehicle is in the vicinity

Trash, Recycling and Yard Waste

Present your collection materials at the curb just like normal. Construction Crews will allow Republic Services trucks into the construction zone.

Project Funding

This project is funded by the City Capital Projects Fund and a grant from the Federal Highways Administration administered by MODOT.

Curbs, Gutters & Driveways

Existing rolled curbs and gutters will be replaced with mountable concrete curbs. The Contractor will need to pour the curb across driveway entrances to create a continuous gutter line. As part of the project driveway aprons will be replaced. Spencer Contracting will notify each property owner to schedule work. If no one is home a door hanger will be left at your property with contact information. In some cases they will replace the apron and sidewalk in 2 sections to allow continuous property access. Concrete has a minimum curing time of five days, so you will be unable to use your driveway at least this amount of time. The City's Contractor is required to give residents 72 hours notice prior to limiting access to a driveway.

Mail Delivery

The USPS is working with the City and Contractor to ensure that mail service is not interrupted.
