February 28, 2023

The Olivette City Council met on February 28, 2023 at 7:00 PM via videoconferencing, livestreaming and in person. Mayor Weil called the meeting to order.

Acting City Clerk Mandle read Bill #2995 - An Ordinance Amending The Olivette Municipal Code By Enacting A New Chapter 450 Regulating Marijuana Facilities, by title only.

Mayor Weil stated a public hearing had already been held and tonight the Council would have a discussion of amendments to Chapter 450. City Attorney Martin explained the changes suggested for Chapter 450. Discussion was had regarding suggested amendments.

Acting City Clerk Mandle read Bill #2997 – An Ordinance Authorizing Certain Revisions To The Documents Approved By Ordinance #2727 Relating To The Issuance Of Taxable Industrial Revenue Bonds For A Project Located On The Irvington Court And Reym Court In The City of Olivette, for the second time, by title only.

Item #9 – Bill #2998 – An Ordinance Authorizing A Special Permit To Honig Management, LLC To Operate A Private Dog Club And Dog Run Facility On The Property Grounds Addressed As 1160 Walters Way Lane, Zoned “LID” Light Industrial District. First Reading

Acting City Clerk Mandle read Bill #2998 - An Ordinance Authorizing A Special Permit To Honig Management, LLC To Operate A Private Dog Club And Dog Run Facility On The Property Grounds Addressed As 1160 Walters Way Lane, Zoned “LID” Light Industrial District, for the first time, by title only.

Planning and Community Development Director Carlos Trejo addressed the Council stating this bill would authorize a special permit to Honig Management, LLC to construct and operate a “private” dog club and dog run facility at the vacant and undeveloped property addressed as 1160 Walters Way Lane. There will be a second reading and public hearing on March 14, 2023.

Item #10 – Authorization To Purchase Parks Utility Vehicle

Parks and Recreation Director Beverly Tucker Knight addressed the Council stating this new utility vehicle (UTV) will replace the original UTV which was purchased in 1999. The new UTV will clear the park pathways and the new Great Rivers Greenway paths, in addition to standard park duties. The vehicle on the Missouri state bid meets the criteria and is available for purchase from S&H Farm Supply in Lebanon, MO. The purchase price of \$37,035 is within the amount authorized in the FY22-23 Capital Improvement Plan.

Chairman Pro-tem Carl made a motion to authorize purchase of park utility vehicle and delivery not to exceed \$37,035. Motion seconded by Council Member Waldman.

Police Chief Beth Andreski addressed the Council stating this grant funding request included a total of \$8,000 on overtime pay for traffic enforcement, as well as grant funding to cover the cost of two (2) electronic radar speed signs. These electronic radar speed signs will also collect traffic data. The electronic radar speed sign requested is the Radarsign TC-400 and was chosen based on cost efficiency, portability and data collection which would meet the Department’s needs.

Age will be verified and persons 21 years and older will be given a wrist bracelet. HFHP has completed the City’s license application and provided verification of their tax-exempt status. Approval will be contingent upon the Police Department’s background check.
