July 13, 2021

The Olivette City Council met on July 13, 2021 at 7:04 PM via videoconferencing and livestreaming. Mayor Clark called the meeting to order.

Item #1 – Roll call

On roll call, the following persons were present: Mayor Sidney Clark, Chairman Pro-tem Maxine Weil, Council Member Greg Carl, Council Member Missy Waldman. Council Member Ruth Springer was absent with excuse.

Also, in attendance were City Manager Barbara Sondag, City Attorney Paul Martin, Finance Director Darren Mann, Planning and Community Development Director Carlos Trejo, Public Works Director Bruce McGregor and Acting City Clerk Denise Mandle.

Planning and Community Director Carlos Trejo addressed the Council requesting a public hearing on this bill.

Acting City Clerk Mandle read Bill #2953 - An Ordinance To Create A Planned Development District By Approving The Vacation Of The Streets Known As Irvington Court And Reyem Court; Approving The Consolidation Of 4.926 Acres Of Property To Be Known As Olivette Apartments Boundary Adjustment Plat From "SR" Single Family Residential District To "M-U" Gateway I-170/Olive Boulevard Mixed-Use Gateway District; And Approving A Development Plan And Designating A Planned Development District To Be Known As The Irvington-Reyem Olivette Apartments, for the second time, by title only.

Item #8 – Bill #2955 – An Ordinance To Amend On-Site Detention Requirements For Single Family Homes Under Section 422.080 Single-Family Residential Development, Being Part Of Chapter 422 Stormwater Management Of Title IV Land Use Of The Olivette Municipal Code. First Reading

Acting City Clerk Mandle read Bill #2955 - An Ordinance To Amend On-Site Detention Requirements For Single Family Homes Under Section 422.080 Single-Family Residential Development, Being Part Of Chapter 422 Stormwater Management Of Title IV Land Use Of The Olivette Municipal Code, for the first time, by title only.

Planning and Community Development Director Carlos Trejo addressed the Council stating there will be a second reading and public hearing on this bill on July 27, 2021.

Acting City Clerk Mandle read Bill #2956 - An Ordinance To Amend Section 500.100 Permitted Hours Of Construction, Being Part Of Chapter 500 Building Regulations Of Title V Building And Construction Of The Olivette Municipal Code, for the first time, by title only.

CPD Director Trejo addressed the Council stating this bill is before Council for a first reading and will have a second reading on July 27, 2021.

Item #10 – Bill #2957 – An Ordinance Authorizing Execution Of A Missouri Highways And Transportation Commission Transportation Alternatives Funds Program Agreement For Construction Of A Section Of The Centennial Greenway. First Reading

City Manager Sondag addressed the Council stating the Council is asked to hold a first reading on an Ordinance to authorize execution of a Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant agreement with Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission.

Item #11 – OMCI Application

Public Works Director Bruce McGregor addressed the Council stating the Metropolitan Sewer District is sharing a prorated portion of storm water tax revenue with the City of Olivette through the OCMI reimbursement program. The two watershed areas in Olivette are River Des Peres (RDP) and Deer Creek with eligible funds of \$79,709 and \$38,287 respectively.

City staff met with Len Madalon, EDM consulting engineer, to walk possible project locations in both water sheds and discussed current storm water issues. Based on the need’s assessment prepared by EDM, staff recommends accumulating Deer Creek funds for future use and applying for RDP funds to design stormwater improvements between Llewellyn Lane and Dolores Avenue.

Council Member Waldman made a motion to authorize City staff to submit an OMCI reimbursement application for engineering services related to storm water improvements between Llewellyn Lane and Dolores Avenue. Motion seconded by Chairman Pro-tem Weil.

Public Works Director Bruce McGregor addressed the Council stating staff has determined it is in the City’s best interest to replace the 2009 F350 Diesel 4x4 before significant repairs are required. This item is for the truck purchase only and there will be another submission for the build items. There is a significant production back log and delivery is expected six months after approval.

Council Member Carl made a motion to authorize the purchase of a 2020 Ford F350 4x4 as outlined in the attached Joe Machens Ford letter, not to exceed \$36,601. Motion seconded by Chairman Pro-tem Weil.
